



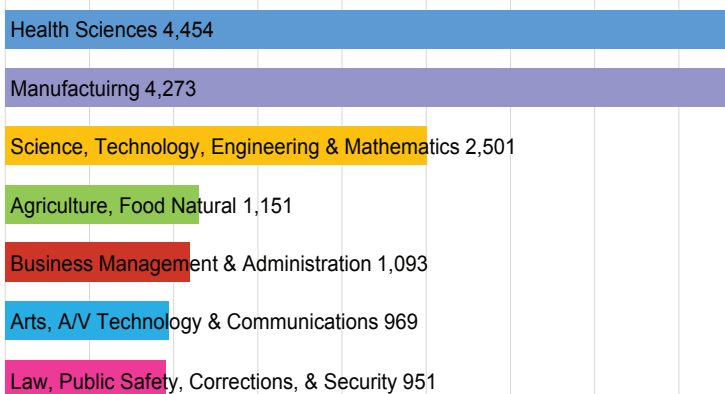
Connecting Classroom Learning with Workplace Expectations

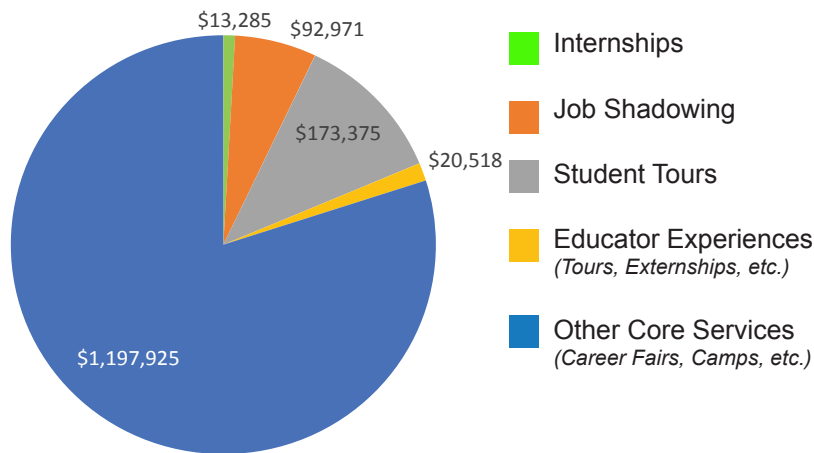
Work-Based Learning Experiences

Work-Based Learning Support \$19.66 per Participant



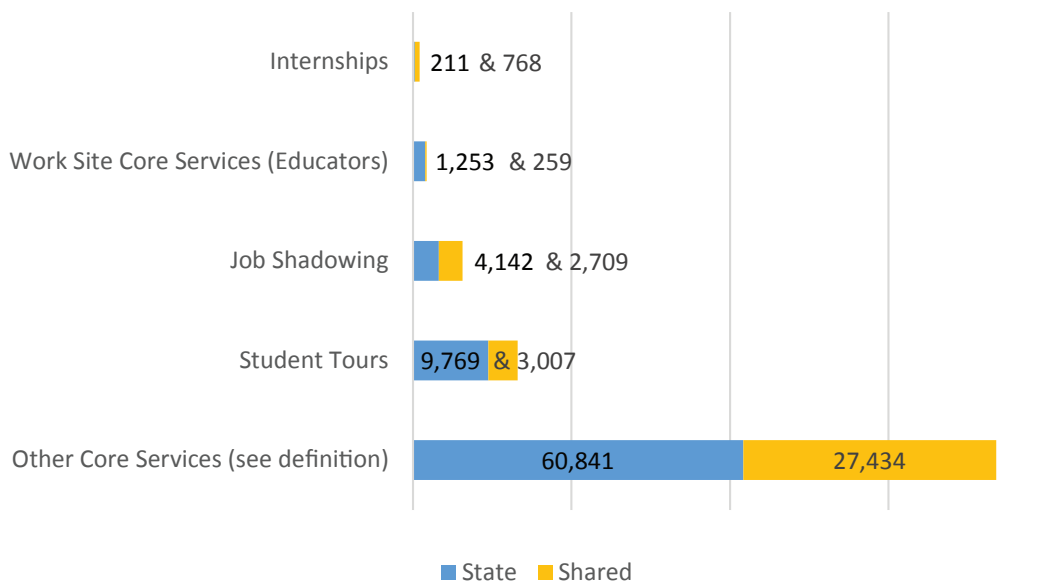
State and Shared Resources
