In addition to education and training programs that meet state workforce needs broadly, economic development staff also work with businesses to customize training to meet specific needs.

Iowa Skilled Worker and Job Creation Fund

The Iowa Skilled Worker and Job Creation fund encompasses many aspects of how Iowa's Community Colleges support worker training and job creation efforts. With programs for tuition assistance, work-based learning, and adult literacy, we are increasing the number of Iowans from all social and economic backgrounds who have the skills and industry-recognized credentials needed to secure gainful employment.

New & Expanding WorkforceIndustrial New Jobs Training (260E)

The lowa New Jobs Training Program (260E) drives the creation of new jobs by supporting training for employees added through expansion in, or relocation to, Iowa. Community College economic developers work with businesses to develop and implement an effective training plan to build the skills needed for new employees at no cost to a business. Training is funded by the Community Colleges through the sale of certificates for the amount of anticipated tax revenue generated from new employees' salaries.

Upskilling Current Workforce Iowa Jobs Training (260F)

The Iowa Jobs Training Program (260F) helps Iowa businesses train and upskill current employees. The program fosters the growth and competitiveness of Iowa businesses by ensuring that Iowa's workforce has the skills and expertise needed to compete worldwide. Training programs are customized to meet the specific productivity needs of each business. \$4.75 million is available annually statewide and matched by participating businesses.
