HF 648	An Act relating to career and technical education programs and partnerships and including effective date provisions.	Filed by House Appropriations. Passed House unanimously on April 19, 2017. Referred to Senate Appropriations subcommittee of Rozenboom, Danielson, and Green on January 10. Provides for CTE related spending.
HF 2001	An Act relating to service dogs and assistive animals in residential rental property, providing for landlord remedies to remove dogs and animals, and providing penalties for misrepresenting an animal as a service dog or assistive animal.	Filed by Salmon. Referred to House Commerce on January 10.
HF 2006	An Act providing for brain injury policies for certain extracurricular interscholastic activities, and including applicability provisions for K12.	Introduced by Jones. Referred to House Education on January 10.
HF 2007	An Act relating to subject and performance-based assessments administered prior to a student’s completion of a practitioner preparation program.	Filed by Wills, and referred to House Education subcommittee of Moore, Wheeler, and Smith on January 16. Requires those who fail a teacher preparation preprofessional skills test to be denied enrollment.
HF 2015	An Act relating to education by modifying the duties and authority of certain state and local governmental entities, and including effective date provisions.	Introduced by Zaun. Referred to Labor and Business Relations on January 9.
HF 2016	An Act concerning the regulation of elections by establishing requirements for election to public office, assessing election costs to candidates, and affecting vote tabulations for public referenda.	Introduced by Hunter. Referred to House State Government

		subcommittee of Highfill, Hunter and Koester on January 16.
<u>HF 2017</u>	An Act relating to the elimination and transition of duties of the department of public health.	Filed by M. Jones. Referred to House State Government subcommittee of Highfill, Koester, and R. Smith on January 16.
<u>HF 2019</u>	An Act permitting employers to provide employees with wage statements by electronic means.	Filed by Rogers and referred to House Labor subcommittee of Klein, Jacobsen, and McConkey on January 16.
<u>HF 2021</u>	An Act relating to assessments administered to a student prior to completing an approved practitioner preparation program.	Filed by Salmon, and referred to House Education on January 11. Provides exceptions to denying enrollment those who fail the assessment twice.
<u>HF 2047</u>	An Act creating a legislative tax credit review committee as a committee of the legislative council to review all tax credits at public meetings.	Referred to House Ways and Means on January 18.
<u>HSB 514</u>	An Act setting the dates for the submission of local public measures to the electors.	Introduced by House Local Government, and referred to subcommittee of Highfill, Jones and Meyer on January 10. Requires all propositions, including bonds, to be held in conjunction with the November election.
<u>HSB 536</u>	An Act relating to the administration of driving skills tests required for a commercial driver's license.	Filed by House Transportation, and referred to a subcommittee of Hinson, Hager, and Cohoon on January 17. Repeals the 2019 sunset of third party testers.
<u>HSB 551</u>	An Act relating to programs and activities administered by the secretary of state, including the safe at home program, special election dates, candidate and voter registration filing requirements, election audits, voting systems, and civil office vacancies, and including effective date provisions.	Referred to House State Government subcommittee of Bergan, Koester and Winckler on January 18. Moves the special election date for CCs in even-numbered years to the second Tuesday of December.

<u>SF 475</u>	An act relating to educational programs developed or administered by the department or state board of education, school districts, or accredited nonpublic schools, and to school-age children's health screenings, providing for or relating to fees, and including effective date provisions.	Filed by the Senate Education Committee. Passed out of the Senate March 21, 2017. Referred to House Education subcommittee of Wheeler, Hanusa, Moore, Nielsen, and Steckman. Passed out of Education March 28, 2017. Re-referred to House Education on January 8. Re-referred to House

		Education subcommittee of Wheeler, Hanusa, Moore, Nielsen, and Steckman January 16. Section 11 addresses supplemental weighting for CTE in this DE omnibus bill remaining file in the 2017 Session.
<u>SF 481</u>	An Act relating to the enforcement of immigration laws and providing penalties and remedies, including the denial of state funds to certain entities.	Filed by Senate Local Government Committee, and referred to subcommittee of Garrett, McCoy, and Guth. Passed Senate Local Government March 7, 2017 and referred to the Senate Calendar. Passed Senate April 12, 2017.
<u>SF 2004</u>	An Act providing for school employee training relating to 1 suicide awareness and prevention.	Introduced in Senate Education and referred to a subcommittee of C. Johnson, Quirnbach, and Sinclair on January 9. Passed subcommittee on January 18.
<u>SF 2010</u>	An Act relating to peace officers, reserve peace officers, and federal officers going armed with, carrying, transporting a firearm on school grounds.	Filed by Kinney and referred to Senate Judiciary and to a subcommittee of Kinney, Dawson, and Shipley on January 10.
<u>SF 2012</u>	An Act relating to child care assistance provider reimbursement rates and the care of children in licensed get-well centers.	Filed by Hogg, and referred to Human Resources subcommittee of Costello, Bolkcom, and Chapman on January 16.
<u>SF 2017</u>	An Act relating to education by modifying the duties and authority of certain state and local governmental entities, and including effective date provisions.	Filed by Zaun. Referred to Senate Education subcommittee of Chelgren, Dvorsky, and Edler on January 10. Eliminates the current Iowa Code language for DE and transfers the duties.
<u>SF 2025</u>	An Act relating to carrying or possessing a dangerous weapon when entering real property if a written notice forbidding such entry has been conspicuously posted, and providing penalties.	Introduced by Bolkcom. Referred to Judiciary Subcommittee of Dawson, Bisignano, and Sinclair on January 11. Prohibits having such weapons when notices are posted except for the owner, peace officers, member of the armed forces, and similar.
<u>SF 2046</u>	An Act relating to tuition and fee waivers for students enrolled in postsecondary studies in in-demand career fields and to prioritizing certain state grants and scholarships for such students.	Referred to Senate Education and a subcommittee of Chelgren, Dvorsky, and Kraayenbrink on January 17. Requires CCs to waive tuition and fees for programs leading to “in-demand” careers.
<u>SF 2064</u>	An Act relating to the earliest school calendar start date on or about August 23.	Introduced by Feenstra, and referred to Senate Education on January 18.

<u>SSB 3001</u>	An Act requiring the department of education to include references to state or federal statutory or regulatory provisions necessitating the inclusion of information in reports filed with the department.	Filed by Senate Education and referred to subcommittee of Chelgren, Edler and Hogg on January 9.
<u>SSB 3006</u>	An Act relating to the definition of dangerous weapons to include simulated firearms.	Introduced by Zaun and referred Judiciary subcommittee of Dawson, Shipley and Kinney.
<u>SSB 3022</u>	An Act relating concerning public investment maturity limitations relating to the operating funds of political subdivisions.	Filed by Senate State Government and referred to a subcommittee of R. Smith, Feenstra, and Danielson on January 16. Allows operating funds in excess of 33% to be invested in CDs maturing in five years or less.
