<u>HF 2197</u>	An Act relating to the administration of driving skills tests required for a commercial driver's license.	Filed by House Transportation, and referred to a subcommittee of Hinson, Hager, and Cohoon. Passed the subcommittee and placed on the House debate calendar on February 1. Repeals the 2019 sunset of third party testers. Formerly HSB536.

<u>HSB 514</u>	An Act setting the dates for the submission of local public measures to the electors.	Introduced by House Local Government, and referred to subcommittee of Highfill, Jones and Meyer on January 10. Requires all propositions, including bonds, to be held in conjunction with the November election.
<u>HSB 536</u>	An Act relating to the administration of driving skills tests required for a commercial driver's license.	Filed by House Transportation, and referred to a subcommittee of Hinson, Hager, and Cohoon on January 17. Repeals the 2019 sunset of third party testers.
<u>HSB 546</u>	An Act defining marketplace contractors and designating marketplace contractors as independent contractors under specified circumstances.	Filed by House Commerce Committee and referred to subcommittee of Wils, Holz, and Kacena on January 18. Passed subcommittee with amendment on January 30.
<u>HSB 548</u>	An Act establishing a retirement savings plan trust, making appropriations, and including contingent implementation and effective date provisions.	Proposed by the State Treasurer and referred to House State Government subcommittee of Highfill, Koester, and Mascher on January 18.

<u>SF 2010</u>	An Act relating to peace officers, reserve peace officers, and federal officers going armed with, carrying, transporting a firearm on school grounds.	Filed by Kinney and referred to Senate Judiciary and to a subcommittee of Kinney, Dawson, and Shipley on January 10.
<u>SF 2012</u>	An Act relating to child care assistance provider reimbursement rates and the care of children in licensed get-well centers.	Filed by Hogg, and referred to Human Resources subcommittee of Costello, Bolkcom, and Chapman on January 16. Passed subcommittee on January 25.

<u>SF 2046</u>	An Act relating to tuition and fee waivers for students enrolled in postsecondary studies in in-demand career fields and to prioritizing certain state grants and scholarships for such students.	Referred to Senate Education and a subcommittee of Chelgren, Dvorsky, and Kraayenbrink on January 17. Requires CCs to waive tuition and fees for programs leading to “in-demand” careers.

<u>SF 2115</u>	An Act creating a private education tax credit available against the individual income tax and including effective date and applicability provisions.	Filed by Chelgren and referred to Senate Ways and Means on January 25.
<u>SF 2117</u>	An Act relating to public funding and regulatory matters and making, reducing, transferring, and supplementing appropriations for expenditures in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and including effective date provisions. <u>SF 2155</u>	An Act relating concerning public investment maturity limitations relating to the operating funds of political subdivisions. Allows operating funds in excess of 33% to be invested in CDs maturing in five years or less. Passed subcommittee on January 31. Formerly SSB3022.

<u>SSB 3022</u>	An Act relating concerning public investment maturity limitations relating to the operating funds of political subdivisions.	Filed by Senate State Government and referred to a subcommittee of R. Smith, Feenstra, and Danielson on January 16. Allows operating funds in excess of 33% to be invested in CDs maturing in five years or less.
<u>SSB 3070</u>	An Act authorizing the board of nursing to issue a limited nursing authorization to a nurse to complete the clinical component of a nurse refresher course.	Introduced and referred to Senate Human Resources subcommittee of Greene, Segebart, and Mathis on January 24. Passed subcommittee on January 30.
<u>SSB 3087</u>	An Act creating a future ready Iowa Act to strengthen workforce development by establishing a registered apprenticeship development program, a volunteer mentoring program, a summer youth intern program, summer postsecondary courses for high school students that are aligned with high-demand career pathways, an employer innovation fund, and future ready Iowa skilled workforce scholarship and grant programs and funds, and including effective date provisions. Allows county/city hospitals to reduce their board size and to provide removal/replacement of board members.
<u>SR 104</u>	A resolution urging the United States Congress to enact the Dream Act of 2017.	Resolution filed and referred to Senate Rules & Administration on January 24.
